

# Non-Leading Interview Techniques

Criteria	Leading	Non-Leading
1. Must not contain the answer	<input type="checkbox"/> Did it happen at your apartment? <input type="checkbox"/> Was your staff person there? <input type="checkbox"/> Did he tell you not to tell anyone?	<input type="checkbox"/> Where did it happen? <input type="checkbox"/> Who was there? <input type="checkbox"/> What was said to you?
2. Must not contain a choice of answers	<input type="checkbox"/> Was she wearing pants or shorts? <input type="checkbox"/> Were you sitting up or lying down? <input type="checkbox"/> Were you scared, angry, or sad?	<input type="checkbox"/> Tell me what she looked like. <input type="checkbox"/> Where were you in the room? <input type="checkbox"/> How did you feel?
3. Must not name the suspect before the interviewee has identified him/her	<input type="checkbox"/> Did your roommate touch you? <input type="checkbox"/> Did your guardian tell you to keep this a secret? <input type="checkbox"/> We've been told you are having a problem with your bus driver	<input type="checkbox"/> Who touched you? <input type="checkbox"/> Has anyone asked you to keep a secret? <input type="checkbox"/> Do you know why you are here?
4. Must not explain the details of the alleged offense	<input type="checkbox"/> Did he make you rub his penis up and down? <input type="checkbox"/> Did white stuff come out of his penis? <input type="checkbox"/> Which finger did she use to hurt you?	<input type="checkbox"/> What did he do next? <input type="checkbox"/> Then what happened? <input type="checkbox"/> What was it that hurt you?
5. Must not contain the interviewer's assumptions	<input type="checkbox"/> We are going to ask some questions about what happened to you <input type="checkbox"/> What kind of car did you go in? <input type="checkbox"/> Where was the bed in the room?	<input type="checkbox"/> Do you know why you are here? <input type="checkbox"/> How did you get there? <input type="checkbox"/> Tell me about where your mom lives.
